Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival

Over the past two years, the Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival has reached out to communities in more than 30 states across this nation. We have met with tens of thousands of people, witnessing the strength of their moral courage in trying times. We have gathered testimonies from hundreds of poor people and we have chronicled their demands for a better society. The following moral agenda is drawn from this deep engagement and commitment to these struggles of the poor and dispossessed. It is also grounded in an empirical assessment of how we have come to this point today. The Souls of Poor Folk: Auditing America report reveals how the evils of systemic racism, poverty, ecological devastation, and the war economy and militarism are persistent, pervasive, and perpetuated by a distorted moral narrative that must be challenged.

We must stop the attention violence that refuses to see these injustices and acknowledge the human and economic costs of inequality. We believe that when decent people see the faces and facts that the Souls of Poor Folk Audit presents, they will be moved deeply in their conscience to change things. When confronted with the undeniable truth of unconscionable cruelty to our fellow human beings, we must join the ranks of those who are determined not to rest until justice and equality are a reality for all.

God has called God's people to work for justice and on behalf of the poor for more than 2,000 years. Micah's call (6:8) is the basis of our vision. The 2017 General Assembly of our denomination, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), heard this call in the plans for the new Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival and answered with adoption of a resolution to support this effort based on Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s original campaign 50 years ago. Disciples across the life of the Church are organizing to support the initial 40 Days of Moral Action from May 14 to June 23, 2018.

The Ohio Poor People's Campaign invites concerned people to engage in Moral Action at the Ohio State Capitol on each Monday, up to the June 23 end of the Campaign. Pastor Jack will be participating. If you would like more information, or if you would like to attend a rally, please let him know. Otherwise, please pray for the Poor People's Campaign.

VISION

A community and world where all people are loved unconditionally, healed comprehensively, and valued universally.

MISSION

First Christian Church will be a transformational church body that helps people to know Jesus Christ; practices extravagant hospitality that heals; and shows Jesus' love through caring, sharing faith, and resisting injustice. (Micah 6:8-9; Matthew 25:31-46)

THREE TEAMS TO DELIVER MINISTRIES THAT RESPOND TO OUR VISION AND MISSION

1. Knowing Jesus Christ

Thoughtful worship with energetic praise, life-touching prayer, and relevant messages that call listeners to deepen their visible commitment to Jesus Christ, and a call for all to share in the Lord's Supper; Currently, we offer:

*Sunday morning and weekday Bible classes that study the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, help people receive him more deeply into their hearts, and become his disciples.

*Age appropriate youth ministry that fosters Christian character and builds faith leaders;

*A mid-week gathering for quiet prayer, singing and faith-filled conversation.

2. Extravagant Christian Hospitality that Heals Brokenness – Receiving everybody, rejecting nobody.

First Christian Church interprets human diversity as a gift of God, a sign of our collective strength, and an altogether good thing! Through these affirmations, we welcome all people into the fabric of faith and life in the church. Whatever your gender identification, race, culture, ethnic background, sexual orientation, economic circumstance, family configuration, age, mental health status, or difference in ability may be, you are a person of dignity and worth, and we will receive you with honor and joy!

3. Sharing Jesus' Radical Message of Love that Overcomes Fear

We will help people form and share their stories of God's redemptive love, and work together to bring people of no faith to faith in Jesus; show care for hurting people; and refuse to remain silent when acts of hate, discrimination and violence threaten God's people.
