However, when I think of the well-worn phrase "congregational transformation," I think of a process of change, one through which God reminds a congregation of its divine purpose, and works to transform it from a collection of individual "members" into a team of Christ's disciples that spreads his revolutionary love, his sustainable hope, and his vision of justice to people near and far.

The Apostle Paul, whom I lovingly refer to as the "Artist Formerly Known as Saul," is the poster child for divine transformation. Remember his Damascus Road experience, when Christ changed his heart from one of political violence to prophetic vision through Christ? (Acts 9:1019) Paul would later challenge Roman Christians to avoid conforming to the world and instead be "transformed by the renewing of their minds" in Romans 12:2.

The question for North American congregations is this: Are we a social club that mirrors the trends and values of society or are we part of the body of Christ with a divine agenda? By all estimates, including those of this writer, the social club view of church has contributed to its decline. I believe that the one true hope for congregations to enjoy theological credibility and Reign (Kingdom) of God social impact rests with their willingness to live as part of the body of Christ and pursue his vision of love dismounting fear, hope dismembering despair, and peace dismantling violence.

Pursuing Christ's vision involves more than a majority win vote in a church meeting. Instead it calls for congregants like all of us to submit ourselves to God through prayer and the purposeful study of scripture, in an effort to permit God to transform us from being church members into Christ's disciples. It involves us listening to God with other congregational disciples in order for the church body itself to visibly move toward living the sentiments of submission as inspired by an epic hymn, "Have thine own way, Lord. Have thine own way. Thou art the potter, (we) are the clay."

When Christ's vision becomes our vision, church will become less of a place we go, and more of a divinely inspired body through which Christ forms our identity, informs our decisions, and fuels our actions. Of course, this mean we will experience transformation!

"For today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." - Luke 2:11

This "savior" stuff doesn't come naturally to our contemporary, self-reliant, "can-do" culture. We're all for healing the world but less inclined to admit we also need a healer. We can identify racism, sexism and xenophobia in our culture and be slow to admit the need to exorcise those demons from ourselves.

Meanwhile, we know dentists cannot put fillings in their own teeth, a hairstylist cannot adequately do his own hair and a surgeon cannot operate on herself. We cannot baptize ourselves or serve ourselves communion, but we still struggle to admit we can only be restored by surrendering to a Presence larger and wiser than ourselves.

I understand the reluctance. Part of me would rather believe I can improve myself through my own efforts: a spiritual tweak here, a moral upgrade there, instead of admitting I need a total overhaul of heart and mind.

Here's why: If I am healed by my own efforts, there would be limits to what God could ask of me. But if I am healed by the grace of God in Christ, then I belong to Christ and I owe God everything.

That's scary until we realize there is nothing more liberating than giving everything to God and nothing more terrifying than being left to our own devices. Giving up control is frightening until we acknowledge we have never been in control for a day in our lives. Life begins when we turn to our Savior, one day, one moment, at a time.
